- More than 48,000 government officials completed the online training course.

Impact:

- Proactive disclosure of assessment aware citizens about all services they can avail. Eventually it will make an positive impact on countries GDP and Human development indicator.
- Enhanced capacity of government officials will strengthen the supply side of information disclosure
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Promoting Citizens' Access to Information

Organized weeklong RTI Camp and a follow up camp involving marginalized people in a remote village.

- Success: Introduced wall writing as an effective tool of information disclosure
- Impact: People can easily get information on safety net programme and allocation of union budget. Replication of the intervention in other villages will have a greater impact.

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Promoting Citizens' Access to Information

- Success: Asharaf Hossain, a participant of RTI camp turned up as an RTI - torchbearer
- *Impact*: People are getting benefits from different public institutions. Replication of such initiative will multiply impact.











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Major Recommendations
