

Challenges faced by Ministry/Agency in Implementing Social Security Programmes

- Lack of Data base about Orphan and Venerable
 Children or Children at Risk
- Coordination among line Ministries based on MIS
- Remove hunger & poverty for the children at Risk
- Low coverage and low level of funding.
- Increasing Ageing population & breakdown in traditional care practice.
- In beneficiary selection, have to increase poor & vulnerable people & exclude the non-poor
- No formal Monitoring & Evaluation (M&E) system
- No Formal System or Strategy for emergency response for the vulnerable children and older people

- It is needed for the comprehensive and effective management System for institutional care
- Individual budget for the resident should be increased
- It develop coordination among ministries regarding food securities and emergency response
- Train up all the officials of MoSW at field level for emergency response and procedure for emergency
