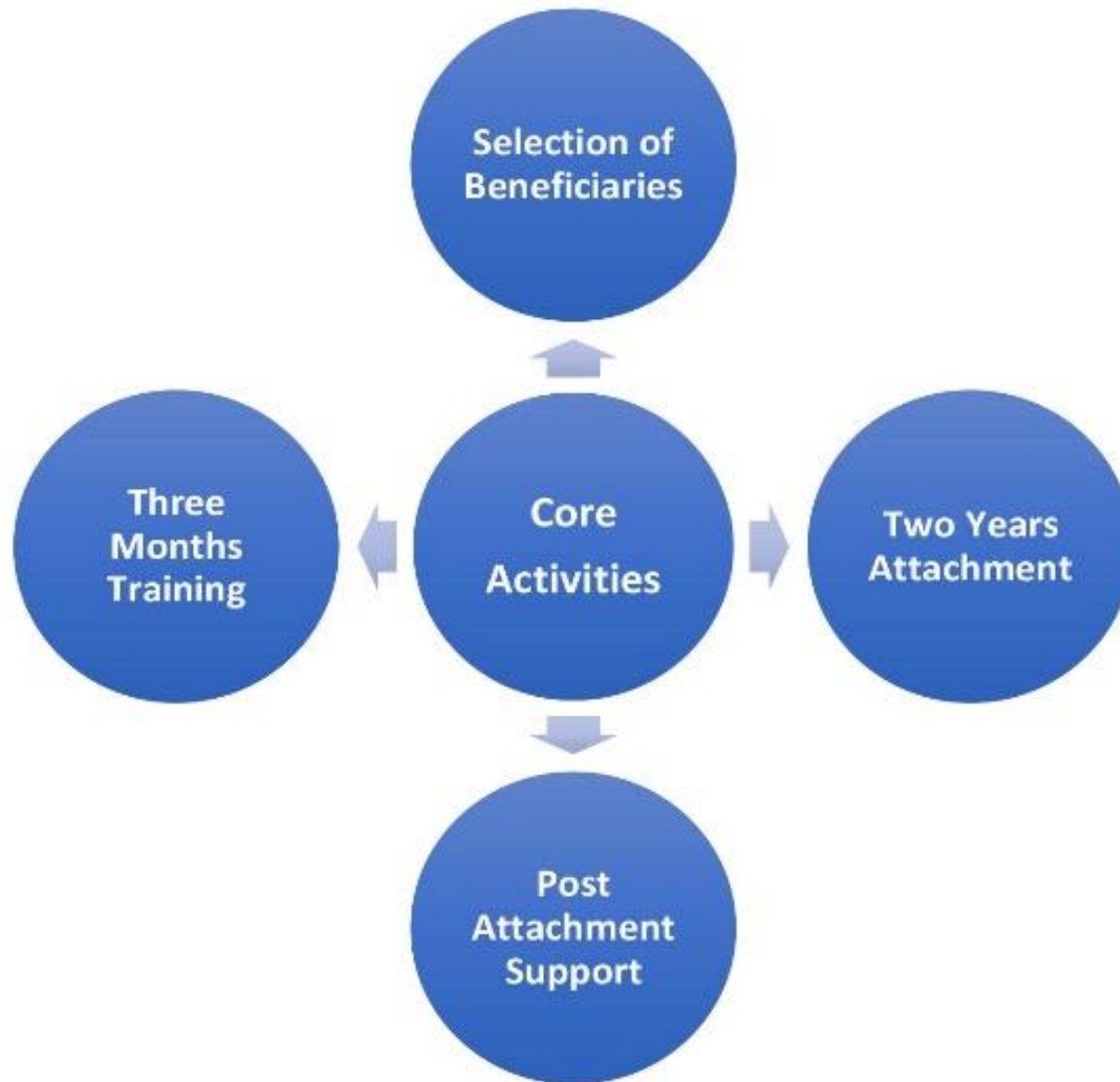
What is National Service Programme ?

National Service Programme is a poverty alleviation programme of the govt. of Bangladesh for the college educated unemployed youths through skill development and practical attachment with nation building activities in the rural areas.

Salient features of NSP:

i)	Unemployed youth aged 24-35 years with higher secondary level education are the target group;
ii)	Being implemented according to the poverty situation across the country;
iii)	Youths join on self-motivation;
iv)	Skill training supported with practical experience and
v)	It is a unique programme for the unemployed youth for capacity building as well as involving them in the nation building activities.

Core Activities



Activities:

- ▶ Selection of the beneficiaries;
- ▶ Three months skills training to the selected unemployed youths ;
- ▶ Two years attachment/ temporary employment of the trained youths &
- ▶ Continuing support to the beneficiaries after completion of attachment period.

Modules of Training

Compulsory Modules

- Nation and character building.
- Disaster management and Social Service.
- Basic Computer Course.
- Self-employment.

Optional Modules

- Idea of different service sectors of the Govt;
- Health and Family Planning Services;
- Education and Physical education;
- Agriculture, Forest and Environment;
- Social Security and law & Order;
- Union Parishad and Upazilla Parishad (Local Bodies) activities/services.

Fields of attachment/temporary employment

Fields of attachment are as following -

1. Education sectors(primary, secondary and college level);
2. Health & Family planning ;
3. Agriculture Department;
4. Livestock Department;
5. Fisheries Department;
6. Forestry Department;
7. Law & Order control;
8. Local Govt. offices;
9. Department of Youth Development ;
10. Other govt. offices.

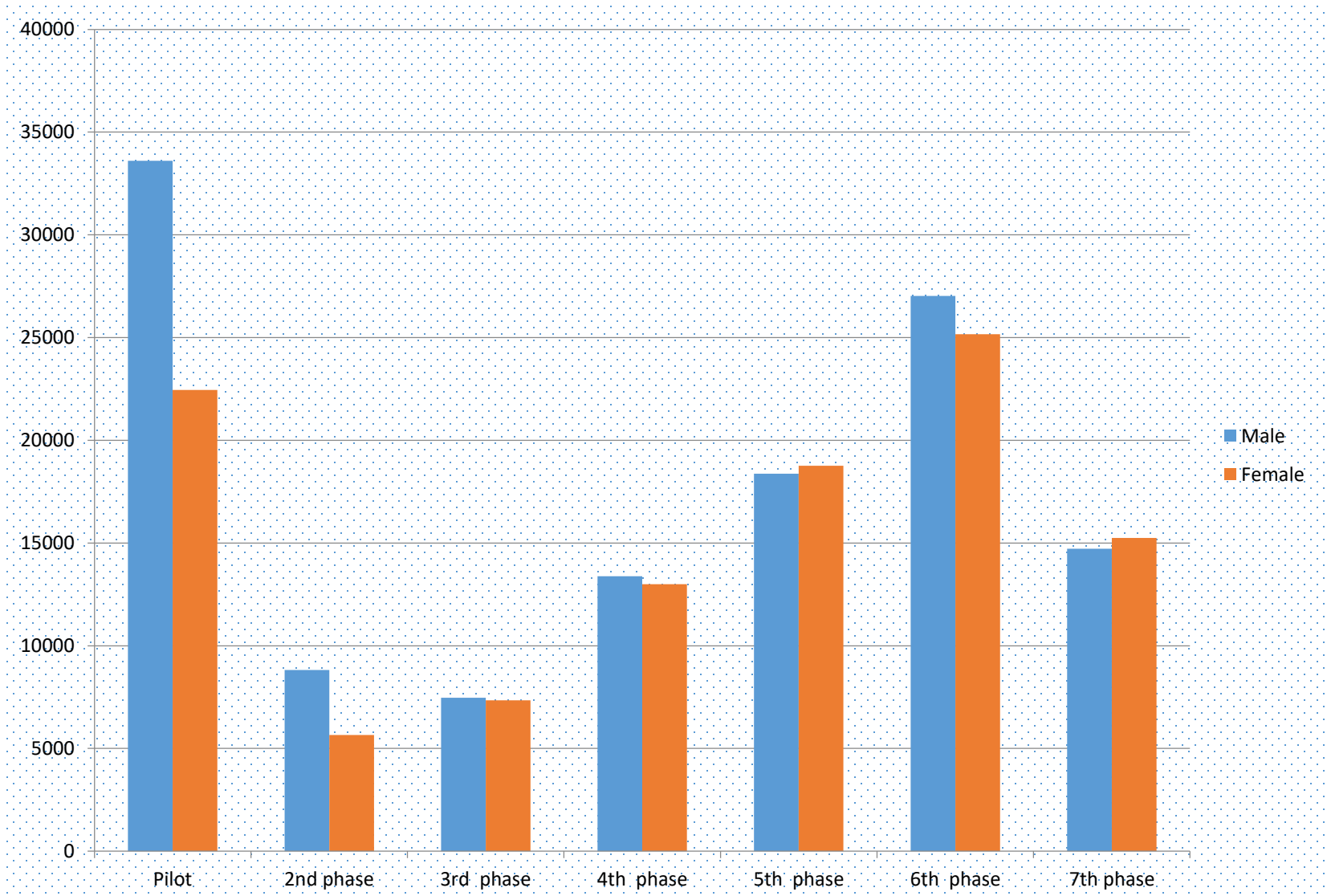

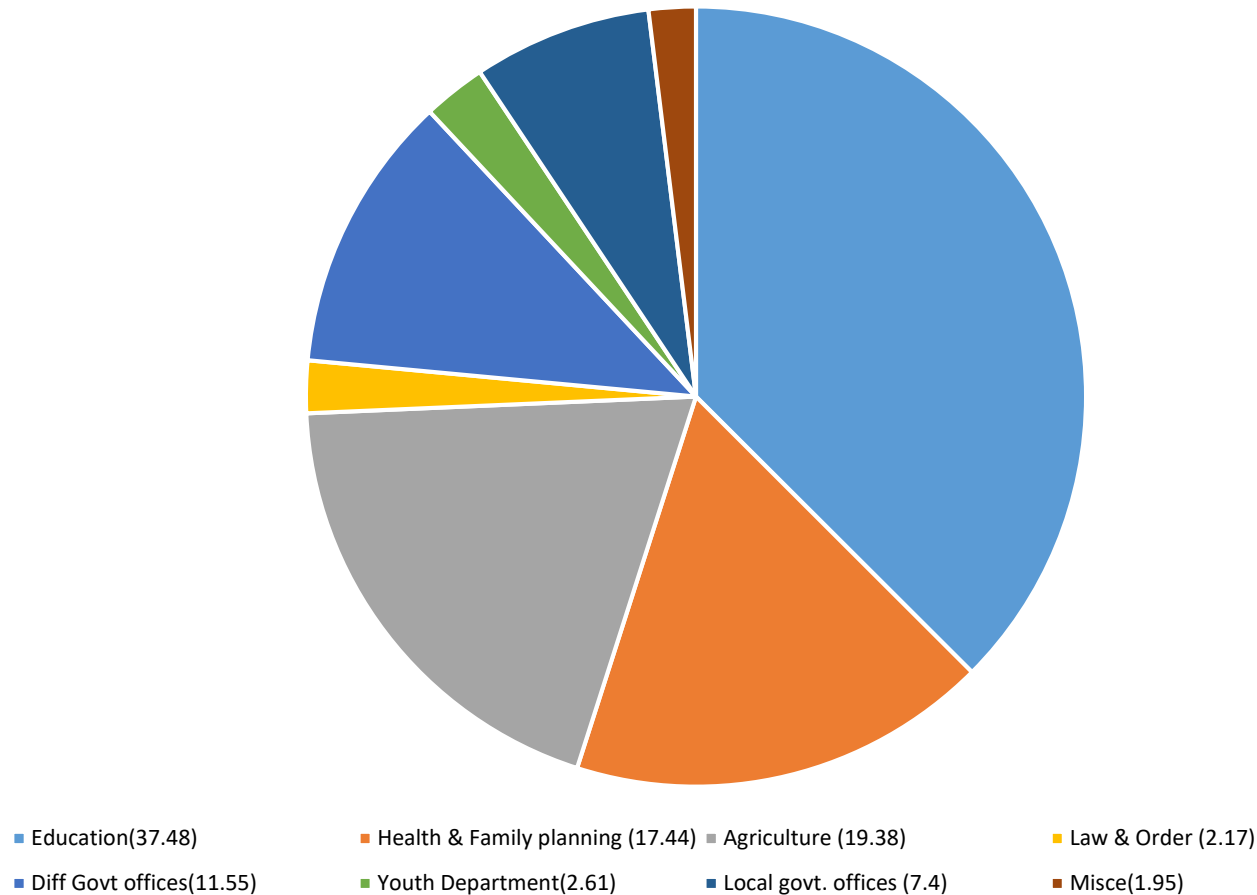

Financial benefit provided to the beneficiaries

1	Every youth gets Tk. 100 as daily training allowance during training period
2	Each of the youth gets Tk. 200 as services allowance daily (monthly TK 6000/-) and the money is deposited in their bank accounts.
3	Every youth must keep as savings TK 2000/- per month in his/her account which he/she will get in total after completion of temporary employment.
4	From inception up to June 2017 benefits given to the beneficiaries are as under:

Training allowances given among- 210274	140.93 core
Allowances for temporary employment among- 207939	1682.87 core
Refundable deposits distributed among- 99157	522.04 core
