





Target 1.3: Implement nationally appropriate <u>social protection systems</u> and measures for all, including floors, and by 2030 achieve substantial coverage of the poor and the vulnerable

Target 5.4: Recognize and value unpaid care and domestic work through the provision of public services, infrastructure and <u>social protection policies</u> and the promotion of shared responsibility within the household and the family as nationally appropriate



Target 8.5: By 2030, <u>achieve full and productive employment</u> and decent work for all women and men, including for young people and <u>persons with disabilities</u>, and equal pay for work of equal value


8.8 Protect labour rights and promote safe and secure working environments for all workers, including migrant workers, in particular women migrants, and those in precarious employment
