




Why Strategic Planning?



National Vision to be a developed country by 2041


Social Security as a Strategic Component



Role of Cabinet Division

Formulation of National Social Security Strategy (NSSS)


Honorable Prime Minister gave directives in 2012 for preparing a comprehensive strategy for social protection reforms

General Economic Division drafted the strategy under close supervision of the Central Monitoring Committee headed by Cabinet Secretary

It was approved in 2015 by the Cabinet

This is a comprehensive road map for reforming social protection along a lifecycle framework

Situation analysis of existing programmes

Action plan of thematic clusters (5)


Features of Action Plan

Major programmes are aligned across lifecycle framework as proposed in NSSS Smaller programmes are proposed to be consolidated – channeled through single umbrella

Both poor (23%) and near poor (48%) have been considered as beneficiaries

Gender focused social protection emphasized

Implementation Timeline

Year 2021

- Programmes will be consolidated along a lifecycle framework
- Selection process will be improved based on poverty score cards
- Single registry MIS will be developed with digital payment system
