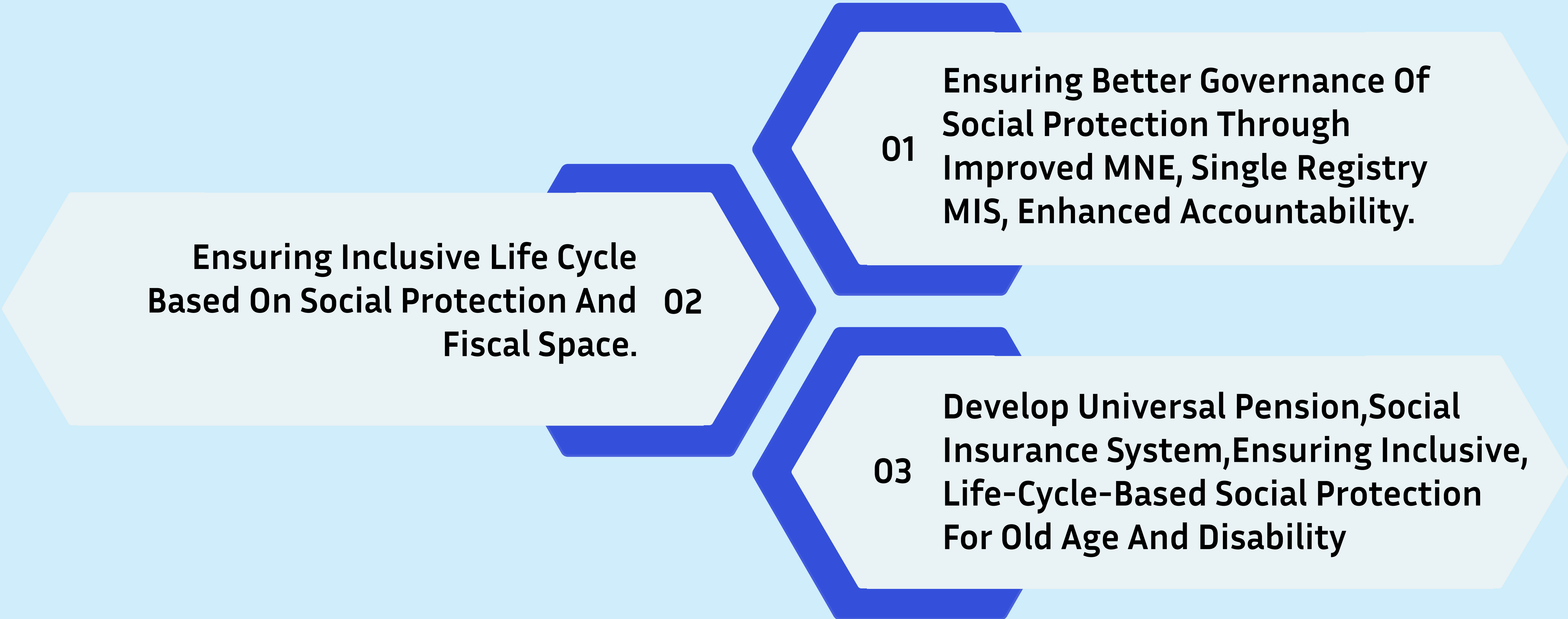


WHAT THE PROGRAMME IS ABOUT
