#### **What is Human Development:**

Human development is the multidisciplinary study and practice of enlarging people's choices and freedoms so they can live long, healthy, pursue a satisfying life, and participate in the life of their community.

It's both a process and an outcome, focusing on building human capabilities and promoting equity, sustainability, productivity, and empowerment, rather than just economic growth.





# What is Social Empowerment?

A process, which develops people's self-confidence and liberty, leading them to act individually and collectively to change border social attitudes and norms which hold them back to poverty and marginalization.

example: school assitance package, and health assitance package.

Loss of voice and influence in society

Based on gender, disability, ethnicity

### Implementation Gaps

#### **Current Challenges**

- Insufficient coverage of stipends and Training Budget
- Programme fragmentation
- Weak inter-ministerial coordination
- Limited monitoring mechanisms
- Lack of awarenss and Training/workshop
- frequent change of focal point

#### **Priority Actions**

- Scale up beneficiary numbers and suffient budget
- Consolidate smaller programmes
- Improve transition planning
- Strengthen cross-cluster coordination
- Awarness building and Training/workshop
- Fixed focal point and separate branch
